Rosa Parks was arrested for refusing to give up her seat on a segregated bus in Montgomery, Alabama. This act of defiance sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott and became a pivotal moment in the Civil Rights Movement.

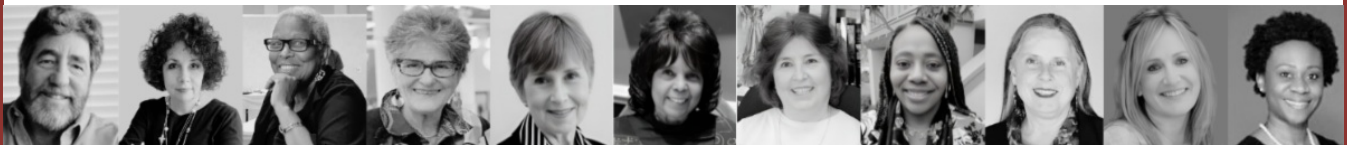

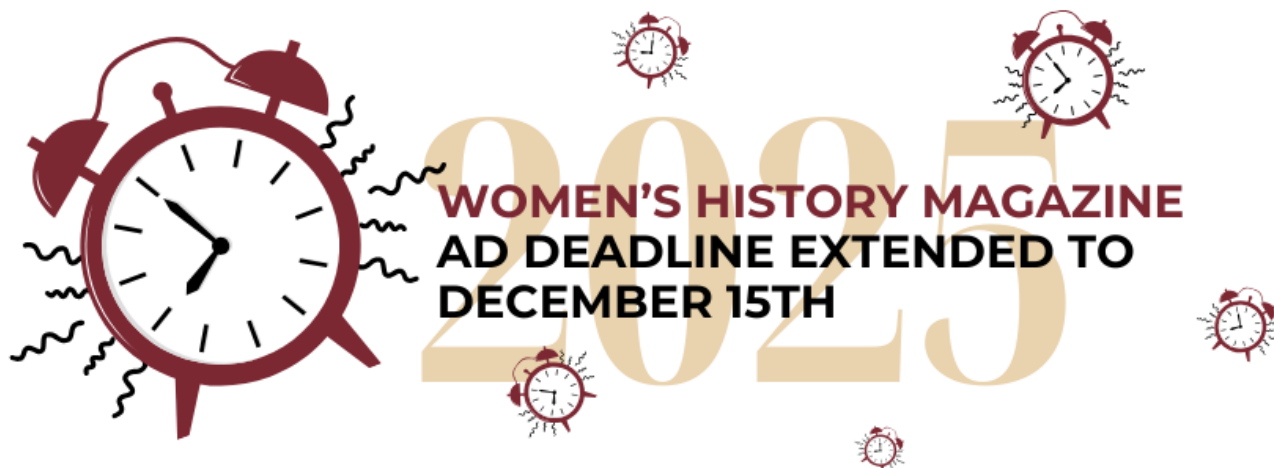
