Born into slavery, Mason eventually gained her freedom in 1856 after challenging her owner in court. Once free, she worked as a nurse and midwife, saving her earnings to purchase land in what would later become downtown Los Angeles. Over time, she amassed significant wealth and became one of the city's first prominent Black landowners.

Known as the "Mother of Black Feminism," Cooper was a writer, educator, and activist who emphasized the importance of education and racial equality in advancing society.




