The 2022 Black History Month Theme is "Black Health and Wellness," which fits nicely with our 2022 Women's History Theme, "Women Providing Healing, Promoting Hope."

All year long we will be honoring women as healers and caregivers. Throughout February, we are featuring stories of some of the remarkable Black women in medicine and caregiving on our <u>social media accounts</u>.

Women like our dear friend and late NWHA board member Dr. Patricia Bath. In addition to her tireless advocacy for improving vision health, her ground-breaking research, and her dedication to mentoring young scientists, she was a fierce supporter of women's history.

Dr. Bath's invention of the Laserphaco Probe was an important milestone in the advent of laser cataract surgery. She co-founded the American Institute for the Prevention of Blindness in 1976, committed to "protect, preserve, and restore the gift of sight." She broke ground for both women and African Americans in medicine and ophthalmology, including being the first African American woman doctor to receive a patent for a medical purpose.



She was one of our <u>2013 Women's History Honorees</u>, "Women Inspiring Innovation Through Imagination: Celebrating Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics."


